Hayreddin Barbarossa

Hayreddin Barbarossa Hizir Reis was born in 1478 on the island of Lesbos, Ottoman empire. His father was Yakup Aga, a Muslim of Turkish origin who was a soldier in the Ottoman empire. He also owned a business in which he transported his goods by ships and boats. Hizir was the third son of his parents. He had two elder brothers Ishak reis, and Oruç reis, he also had a younger brother Ilyas. They all learned sailing from their father.

In his early life, he worked with his brothers in their father's business as a seaman and transported goods by ships and boats before becoming a corsair of the Mediterranean. During their activities against the European forces, they were quite successful in defeating them. The Barbarossa brothers captured Jijel (Now part of Algeria) from the Spaniards in 1516 by overthrowing Algiers's ruler who was supported by the Spaniards. The Ottoman Sultan offered Oruc and Hayreddin financial and military support to recognize the Ottoman claim on Algiers. The Ottoman gave the title of the governor of Algiers to Oruc and after his death, it was passed to Hizir.

He fought against oppression and unjust rulers. He became known as 'Sultan Hayreddin Barbarossa ~ the king of the Mediterranean'. Then he went on to the Battle of Preveza and won an amazing battle along with the Ottomans. He had 122 ships and 20,000 sailors against the Holy League Fleet which had 600 ships and 60,000 sailors. His victory opened Tripoli and the eastern Mediterranean to Ottoman rule.

Hayreddin Barbarossa is a man who went forth and conquered the Mediterranean to bring justice and wipe out oppression. He was given many titles by the people such as 'the wolf of the seas' and 'the hope of the oppressed'. After all, he was also known as the 'sultan of the Mediterranean'. The Ottomans sponsored Hayreddin Barbarossa's explorations because they also wanted to fight the unjust rulers and help people who were being oppressed.

Hayreddin Barbarossa, the great Muslim hero, died on 4th July 1546 in his seaside palace peacefully. He was put to rest in the Barbaros Türbesi in Istanbul on the European side of the Bosphorus. Even today, Turkish ships that pass by his shrine honor him with a special salute or a cannon blast.
