I am delighted to lead and witness the growth of Furqaan Academy Online. Al-Hamdullilah, students from different states have been attending our school. We are working tirelessly to raise awareness of the presence of Furqaan Academy Online all over the United States of America.

Furqaan Academy Online delivers a comprehensive curriculum that includes core and religious studies. Although our classes are conducted virtually, daily LIVE instruction actively promotes interaction between students, their peers and teachers.

Recognizing the need for Islamic education in communities without full time Islamic Schools due to limited resources, we have initiated a project to establish Networked Learning Centers around the United States. Our administrative team is reaching out to different Masajid, and Islamic Cultural Centers to bring Islamic Education to their communities. Furqaan Academy Online aims to collaborate with Masajid or Cultural centers, to provide a platform for students from the community to gather daily at a physical location for online classes.

Al-Hamdulillah this academic year, we have opened our first Networked Learning Center in El Paso, Texas. Students at the Islamic Center of El Paso Networked Learning Center attend classes within a designated classroom under the supervision of a dedicated supervisor, ensuring a safe and conducive learning environment. Students engage in interaction with their peers, enjoy lunch and recess times, and have the opportunity to pray Salah in congregation. Another group of proactive parents are helping us establish a Networked Learning Center in their community Masjid in Maryland.

We encourage parents to identify suitable locations and engage with their local masjid board members to explore partnerships with Furqaan Academy Online as Networked Learning Centers, ensuring that more students have the opportunity to access quality Islamic education.

My Experience at FAO

Before attending Furqaan Academy Online, I did not know how to read Arabic;

Furqaan Academy Online in El-Paso Masjid, Texas

What is an NLC? NLC stands for Networked Learning Centers. This network has been introduced this year by Furqaan Academy Online staff members. These school networks are to be found in different Masajid. El Paso Masjid, in Texas belongs to this network.

This is a group of masajid that have taken FAO as their main school. I am part of the NLC at ICEP (Islamic Center Of El Paso). Furqaan Aademy Online provides classes in El-Paso Masjid since the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year. This is a new addition to the masjid of El Paso in Texas. This masjid has had an elementary school for years and now the Masjid's board members added a middle school and a high school through Furqaan Academy Online programs. My Hifdh Adventure

The Islamic school that I attended before starting the Hifdh program offered a side program that would give the parents an option to send the kids to memorize with a renowned Sheikh in Dallas and they would provide him with a room to teach in.

The Sheikh I learned with was Sheikh Ramadan El-Sabagh from Dallas. The school had provided him with a room to teach in. My parents decided to enroll me in this program.

Finally, after two years, I concluded memorizing the whole Quran and I cannot describe the feeling of completing the Hifdh program successfully. It gives you a very big sense of accomplishment and fills you and your parents with pride. This is something that every single one of us should strive to do. Remember that no matter how hard the process of memorization gets, it will all pay off in the end. I wish you the best of luck in your journey insha'a Allah.

What is Islamic Studies at Furqaan Academy Online?

Advanced Islamic Studies at Furgaan Online

Islamic studies in general refers to the academic study of various aspects of the Islamic faith, including its history, teachings, beliefs, and practices. It involves learning about the Quran, Hadith (sayings and actions of Prophet Muhammad), Islamic law, and other related subjects.

Components of advanced Islamic Studies


