Islamic art is a unique artistic style. Unlike many religions, Islamic art is not limited to artwork made for Muslims. It also includes art and architecture from different countries around the world made by Muslim artists. Islam is not just a religion; it is a special way of life, with its own culture and art style. Additionally, early Islamic art developed more through the connections of existing artistic traditions after the Muslim conquests. Including

artists from Byzantine and Sasanian backgrounds who implemented their styles into art, and shared it with Muslim patrons, which resulted in a unique combination of classical and Iranian designs. Some examples of this include the Dome of the

Rock, which shows implementations from Greco-Roman, Byzantine, and Sasanian styles. The Umayyad caliphate (661– 750) is considered an important period for the development of Islamic art. Overall, Islamic art can be categorized by lineage & ancestry, which is similar to Islamic history, as it began with the Umayyad and Abbasid dynasties and extended to the regional

dynasties including the Safavids, Ottomans, & Mughals. Regardless of its regional differences, Islamic art still carries a strong identity, shown in its many special decorative designs. There are four main types of decoration, which are calligraphy, plant patterns, geometric shapes, and figures.

Alhambra Palace Granada, Spain

The Alhambra is a huge palace and fortress in Granada, Spain. It was built in the 1200s by Muslim rulers from the Nasrid Dynasty, who were the last Muslim rulers in Spain. The name "Alhambra" means "The Red One" in Arabic because the walls almost look reddish. It wasn't built all at once-rulers like Muhammad I and his family added more to it over time. The Alhambra was used as a royal palace for kings, a military base to protect the city, and even like a small city for important people.

The Alhambra has some really famous spots. These include the Nasrid Palaces, the Alcazaba (which is the oldest part and was a fortress), and the Generalife (a big garden area). Inside, there are amazing places like the Court of the Lions full of Arabic writing, cool patterns, and super

detailed designs. There are also a lot of fountains and pools that made the place feel calm and refreshing. When Christian rulers Ferdinand and Isabella took over Granada in 1492, they kept the Alhambra because of how beautiful it was. Even though some parts changed later on, most of the Islamic art and buildings are still there today.

Help with weight loss: When you don't eat for a while, your body uses stored energy, which can lead to weight loss over time. It can also help you lose body fat.



Good for your brain: Some research suggests that fasting might help your brain work better, improve your memory, and protect it as you get older.

Clean up your cells: When you fast, your body goes through a cleaning process where it gets rid of old and damaged parts of your cells, making way for new, healthier ones.

Easier meal planning: Having specific times when you eat can make it simpler to decide what and when to eat.
